LANGUAGE ARTS

During writers' workshop second graders:

- Began to edit their written work to improve sentence fluency
- Used prewriting strategies for creating satisfying endings in writing

In literature studies and small group reading the girls discussed and practiced:

- Examining and identifying characteristics of realistic fiction, historical fiction and biographies
- Summarizing

The second grade word study focus has been:

- Spelling patterns for: r-influenced vowel patterns (-ir, -ur, -er, -ear, -eer, -ire)

MATHEMATICS

During our investigation of number patterns and ratios second graders:

- Used charts to describe constant ratios
- Utilized their understanding of counting by equal groups to solve problems

During our continued focus on operations with whole numbers second graders:

- Worked toward developing computational fluency in addition and subtraction problems with totals to 100
- Conducted experiments with and made generalizations about the addition of even and odd numbers

While studying fractions second graders:

- Learned to identify $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, and $\frac{1}{4}$ of a set and region

SOCIAL STUDIES

During our study of the Westward Expansion second graders:

- Studied the daily lives and the motivation of the pioneers who traveled on the Oregon Trail
- Created a piece of historical fiction from the perspective of someone traveling on the Oregon Trail
- Participated in a simulation of a wagon train journey across the country

CLASS MEETINGS

- During May and June our class meeting topics have included rumors and gossip, inclusivity, dealing with disappointment and developing resiliency.
- In June, the second graders will tour the third grade classrooms, meet the teachers and have time to ask questions about life in third grade.
