Information for Students & Families

Managing and Sending SSAT Score Reports

Change:

In the past, some middle schools provided unofficial SSAT Score Reports to high schools for applying students. Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, this practice will be discontinued. Starting August 1, 2009, Official SSAT Score Reports to be sent to schools to which your student applies must be ordered directly from SSAT.

How Scores are Managed:

The first time a student is registered to take the SSAT – either by the parent, placement director, or educational consultant – a unique user account, complete with log-in information, is created at www.ssat.org. All additional test registrations (should the student take the SSAT more than once) should use the unique student account and log-in information. Anyone ordering a student's scores to be sent to a school or educational consultant also will use the web log-in information to access the student's account. Please note that SSAT web accounts expire at the end of each test year; a test year runs August 1 – July 31. New accounts will need to be created for students taking the test in multiple years.

At the time of the child's first test registration, his/her current school or educational consultant is usually designated as a score recipient. The school or consultant four-digit code is needed to make this designation.

If the family does not want to see the scores before they are sent to schools to which your student may apply, then those schools can be designated to receive scores at the time of test registration. In any event, by using the student's web log-in, additional score recipients may be designated *at any time* during the year at no additional cost.

Information Sharing:

If you expect the school's placement director or an educational consultant to designate that your student's SSAT scores be sent to the schools to which your student is applying, you must provide him/her with the student's account log-in information.
