Welcome to our After School Enrichment Program - ASEP! We have added some exciting new classes and are pleased to offer last winter's most popular classes.

The Spring program begins on **Monday, March 29**. Due to varying vacation and early dismissal days, the classes will end during different weeks. Registration for the program (including fees) must be received by **Tuesday, March 16**. The registration form is located on the last page of this catalog. An e-mail will confirm your course selections after we process your registration. All classes will be offered if they reach their minimum enrollment, which is listed in each course description. Classes may be cancelled if their minimum enrollment is not met seven days prior to class date, in which case fees will be refunded. If you cancel less than eight days prior to the first week of class, fees are not refundable.

Financial assistance is available for students receiving school tuition assistance. Please request financial assistance on the registration form or call Molly for more information.

Spring ASEP classes run for eight weeks. Exceptions are noted in the Course Descriptions of this catalog. **The course fee includes the cost of the Tree House or Study Hall before the class begins, but not afterwards.** ASEP course fees vary according to the time each girl spends in the Tree House or Study Hall. If a class session is missed because of cancellation by the school, a makeup class will be offered.

All ASEP students will report to the Tree House or Study Hall if they have more than a five minute wait between dismissal and their ASEP class. Otherwise, students go directly to their ASEP class at dismissal time.

ASEP pickup is under the pavilion next to the front office. (Just a reminder, no cars are allowed on campus between 3:30-5:00 p.m. Our traffic compliance agreement extends to after school as well as during school, which states that there should be no parking on 32nd Avenue between El Camino Del Mar and California or double parking in the cul-de-sac.) **Please allow five minutes after class ends for the girls to arrive at the front office.** If your student is returning to the Tree House, let us know in advance.

LANGUAGE EXPLORATION: LATIN

Salvete, discipulae! In this course, we will learn the Latin language as used by the ancient Romans via mythology and history. We will study vocabulary, simple grammar structures and the basic parts of speech that will contribute to a greater awareness and appreciation of English and the modern romance languages. Studying Latin will also benefit student's preparation for the SSAT. New material will be covered, so returning and new students are welcome. Valete!

Mr. Sabedra has taught Spanish at Burke's for four years. Mr. Sabedra holds a B.S. from University of Santa Clara and a M.A. in Romance languages from Cornell University.
